Horses Needing a Home



Beau is a beautiful sorrel 2 year old Quarter Horse gelding with flaxen mane and tail. He is halter broke, but he has not been ridden. If you have experience training horses, then this is the perfect horse for you! His adoption fee is \$750 to approved home.



Mia is a 3 year old sorrel gaited Grade mare. She has been well cared for at one of our foster homes since coming to us as a yearling. She just completed her training and is ready for an experienced rider. Adoption fee is \$1200 to an approved home.



Jiggs is a gorgeous dun gelding and he is ready to start his new life as someone's forever horse. Very friendly, halter broke, but not yet started under saddle. If you are looking for a horse that you can train to ride, then this is the horse for you! Adoption fee is \$750 to approved home.



Morning Star is a beautiful 19 year old cremello quarter horse mare with striking blue eyes. She stands 14.1 hands tall. She is broke to ride by an experienced rider. She is pictured on the front page of this newsletter. Her adoption fee is \$900 to an approved home.

Dream is a beautiful 17 year old Palomino registered Missouri Fox Trotter gelding with flaxen mane and tail. He is a "dream" to ride. He stands 15.2 hands high. His adoption fee is \$1,200 to an approved home. We don't often get this caliber of horse, so don't delay!



Starlight is a beautiful 8 year old bay quarter horse cross mare with four white socks. She is 14 hands high. She is broke to ride by an experienced rider and she would benefit from some riding time. She is sound, calm and curious. She will make someone an awesome riding companion.



Choco is a 20 year old Rocky Mountain mare. She is a gentle and friendly horse. She has been ridden in the past. She came in very thin, but she continues to gain weight with the proper care. Her adoption fee is \$700 to approved home.



Sugar is a 12 year old dark liver chestnut Rocky Mountain Horse gelding. He is at the trainer where he will be broke to ride. He is in excellent health and is a sweet horse. His mother is Choco (pictured at left). The adoption fee is \$750 to an approved home.



Recent Arrivals Needing Sponsors

These are some of the horses that we recently took into the Sanctuary. They have various issues ranging from untreated injuries and medical conditions, to malnutrition and neglect. These horses need lots of love and care. Our volunteers are dedicated to helping these horses heal both physically and mentally. Thank you for helping us care for these horses.



Playboy came to us last October with right rear lameness. He is a papered 11 year old quarter horse gelding. This is him at a recent visit to the vet. He is getting steroid injections in his foot. He has shown considerable improvement since his last visit and has a good prognosis. He will probably never be totally sound but WILL walk pain free (and run!) Just another example of what your donations provide. He could use a sponsor or foster home.



King came to us in late October, underweight and needing dental work. He is an 18 year old MFT gelding. Here he is at the vet getting his teeth fixed. He was released by law enforcement to a concerned citizen who was unable to properly care for him. So, she brought him to MFMN. It will take some time for him to regain his strength and weight. He could use a sponsor to help with his vet bills.



Ghost came to us a few weeks ago from a concerned citizen report. Her owner died and she and the property she was left on are in probate. Although someone was responsible for taking care of her, she was found underweight and suffering from neglect. She is 30 years old with worn down teeth, and requires special feed to eat. She is now getting lots of love and attention from the volunteers at MFMN. She could use a sponsor.



Ace is a 3 year old dark bay Standardbred/Fresian mare. She cannot be ridden due to a broken hip, that is now healed. She is healthy and doesn't require any special care. She is very sweet, but a little shy. She loves to be brushed and petted. She would make a great companion horse or she could use a sponsor. Wouldn't you enjoy seeing this pretty face everyday.


